Tha Cung (Michael) Ceu is the 2017 CISNT Student of the Year! Michael is a Junior at Lewisville High School (LHS) Main campus and has been involved in the CISNT programs at both LHS and LHS Killough campus since coming to the US as a Chin refugee in 2013. Michael survived a long and arduous journey from Myanmar to Malaysia, and ultimately to Lewisville, overcoming countless challenges along the way. Upon arrival in America, Michael knew very little English. Through patience, hard work, and dedication, he has grown and mastered conversational English at a rate that is almost unbelievable!

Michael is an incredible leader among his peers in the Chin community as well as in her classes. He was elected President of the CISNT Chin Club at LHS Killough in 2016. This group was developed by the CISNT staff to provide Chin refugee students with peer support, helping them to build positive relationships, celebrate their culture, and organize events. As president, Michael recruited over 25 students to attend and lead the group to organize supportive gatherings that encouraged academic accountability and a supportive network of peers.

As an active member of his church community at Bethel Baptist Church, Michael plays music in the worship band and is very consistent with his practices. Michael is generous with his time and money. He donates to support other Chin refugees on their journey to the US and even spent his savings last summer, taking a trip with his church for the sole purpose of supporting a new Chin church in another state. Michael is always willing to lend a helping hand, works hard, and maintains a positive attitude no matter the circumstances.

“I have been truly impacted by my time working with Michael. He has been an example of resiliency, generosity, and the power of positivity. Michael has faced unimaginable obstacles in life. As a refugee from Myanmar he has experienced life-threatening situations, oppression, fear, and the incredible challenge of adjusting to a new life on the other side of the world from where he grew up.
